

# ALL PARTY PARLIAMENTARY GROUP ON YOUTH AFFAIRS

This briefing note sets out the Liberal Democrat's policies for the 2015 General Election on a number of issues relevant to young people.

### **HOUSING**

The Liberal Democrats will:

- We want to Increase the rate of house building to 300,000 a year with these homes being built to the Zero Carbon Standard.
- Within the first year of the next Parliament we would publish a long term plan setting out how this will be achieved and appoint a ministerial taskforce on housing to oversee the implementation of the plan. It would, amongst other things, contain proposals for at least ten new 'Garden Cities' in England
- We also want to help social housing providers to build more affordable homes to rent, by providing central government investment and more flexibility within the Housing Revenue Account.
- We would work with housing providers on new models of affordable housing, to sit alongside the traditional social rented sector, including those offering path to ownership for lower income working families.

### **EDUCATION AND TRAINING**

The Liberal Democrats will:

- We have committed to protect the education budget in real terms right through from the early years to age 19.
- Guarantee all teachers in state funded schools are fully qualified or working towards Qualified Teacher Status.
- We aim to establish a twin track approach where every young person is either working towards university or an apprenticeship with both paths having an equal status
- We would introduce a Young Person's Discount Card for all aged 16-21, giving an automatic 2/3rds discount on bus travel helping young people travel for work or training
- We plan a major expansion of high-quality and advanced apprenticeships, offering vocational education on a par with academic qualifications backed up by new sector-led National Colleges

### **JOBS AND PAY**

- We will complete the job of balancing the budget on time, in full, and fairly- creating the strong economy fundamental to the creation of new jobs.
- We would invest in training the highly skilled workforce needed for the jobs created b
  our growing industrial sectors such motor vehicles, aerospace, low-carbon energy,
  chemicals, creative industries and more
- We would ask the Low Pay Commission to look at ways of raising the minimum wage without damaging employment opportunities and establish an independent review to consult on how to set a fair Living Wage.
- We would clamp down on abusive practices in relation to zero hours contracts and on those failing to pay the minimum wage.

## **DEMOCRACY**

The Liberal Democrats will:

- Advocate votes at 16 for elections and referenda and we would make it easier to register to vote in schools and colleges.
- We would cap donations to political parties, at £10,000 per person each year, and introduce reforms to prevent undue influence by wealthy interests
- We would reform the House of Lords with a proper democratic mandate and introduce the Single Transferable Vote system for elections to local government and Westminster
